Y1 Robotic Workshop



We continue to be extremely proud of being a School of Sanctuary and the work we do as a community to support those in need, particularly the collaborative achievement in sponsoring a family. The Home Office has approached us to see if we would support another family who are in great need of finding a safe and lasting home and are keen to continue their collaboration with us. It also means that we can further educate our children about the issues around immigration and trafficking in the hope that their knowledge enables them to be considerate, knowledgeable and compassionate humans.

We ask you to join us to fundraise for the resettlement of the new family so we can find a home for them and set it up with their happiness and future prospects in mind. There will be a number of ways in which you can support this initiative and of course your participation is completely voluntary. SCHOOL UNIFORM

We have sent lots of communication about school uniform, PE kits and school bags.

With only a few weeks until the end of term, please continue to support us by ensuring that your children have the correct uniform, including school shoes, PE kits and size school bag.

There are now fewer children coming to school with large backpacks and, as a result, the classrooms are becoming much safer – thank you. Unfortunately, there are still many children bringing large rucksacks into school which we are unable to store safely.

From Monday 1st July, if your child brings in a large bag, you will be asked to take it home. If your child walks to school alone or we are unable to talk to you at the school gate, they will be asked to put it in the office for safe keeping. These children will be able to collect their bags at 3:15 before dismissal. From Tuesday 2nd July, parents/carers will need to collect bags from the school office after dismissal.
