Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this newsletter finds you well. We've had a fantastic week here at St. Saviour's, and as we look ahead to the next few weeks, I'd like to take the opportunity to share some exciting events and updates with you.

I am delighted to announce that all the children will be taking part in this year's Royal Academy 'Young Artist' competition. Our talented artists from Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 will work together to create large collaborative pieces of art, which we will submit for the competition. Each child will contribute a small individual artwork, which will be integrated into the final pieces.

To ensure your child's artwork is included, we kindly ask for formal permission from parents and carers. You will receive a separate letter about this shortly.

I am also thrilled to reveal the Young Transformers projects for the Spring term. These projects offer transformational experiences for our students, helping them grow and make a positive impact on the world around them. Reception will engage in a Mindful Movement Class, exploring the Creative strand. Year I will create Cards for Unsung Heroes, reflecting on the value of Caring. Year 2 will take part in a Litter Picking initiative, embracing Caring for our environment. Year 3 will be inspired by an Inspirational Speaker, building their Confidence. Year 4 will explore Bollywood Dancing, celebrating the Creative arts. Year 5 will participate in a West End Musical Workshop, tapping into their Creativity. Year 6 will create 3D Printed Gifts, promoting Caring and Creativity. By embracing these experiences, we aim to nurture the children's growth in our five strands, empowering them to make a meaningful difference in the world.

Next week, we will have a representative from Safer Routes come to speak with the children about a Waltham Forest initiative to make walking home from school safer. You can find additional information about this project at the back of the newsletter.

Finally, a heartfelt thank you for your continued support with attendance; we truly appreciate your efforts in ensuring your child arrives on time each day. The overall school attendance percentage for this week is 96%

I am delighted to share with you news of an exciting art competition. Every year the Royal Academy holds a 'Young Artist' competition. This year, the artists of St. Saviour's will be taking part. Both Key stage I and key stage two will create large collaborative pieces of art which we will submit. The large pieces will incorporate a small piece of art created by each child.

To include your child's art in the composition, and enter it into the competition, we will need formal permission from parents and carers. The deadline for permission will be Friday 31st January at 4.00pm.


Children aged 4 to 18 can submit work and it's free to enter. Each student can submit one artwork and there is no theme. When you enter, you will submit an image of the artwork plus some information about the piece such as title, size, and some text written by the artist which can include why they created the work and what it means to them. A panel of judges will see the artwork and the selected pieces will be shown in an online exhibition. Some of the artworks will also be shown at the Royal Academy of Arts during July and August.

The artwork can be made using any material; it can be a painting, sculpture, photograph, installation, video, drawing, or a combination. There is no theme so artworks can be of any subject and it doesn't matter when you made the artwork, as long as you are between 4–18 years old when you submit it.






The programme was inspired by the Step Together programme which was piloted in the Midlands and is based on a Chicago model (Safe Passage).

#### ARE YOUNG PEOPLE INVOLVED?

Yes, young people, families and the wider community will be involved in co-designing the Safer Routes pilot.





### WHAT IS SAFER ROUTES?

The Safer Routes pilot is about increasing safety for children and young people on school routes during peak times, which tend to be between 3pm - 6pm.

The pilot is being created to ensure that children and young people are safe when travelling after school at a time of potential risk. We will do this by having trained youth workers visible on these routes who can support them.

We will make children and young people's safety everyone's focus and work together to continue to look out for each other.




## 2. Build Relationships
